

Career Opportunities

With the skills and knowledge developed through their degree, graduates will be equipped to apply for positions in a diverse range of fields such as research and analysis, public or civil services, diplomacy, public policy-making, and social and community services. They may gain employment in institutions such as government departments, universities, the Department of Justice, the Department of International Relations and Cooperation, museums, development agencies and nongovernmental organisations, SANParks. They may also be self-employed or work for consultancy firms.

Admission Requirements

There are prerequisites for this programme that must be met in order to progress through the qualification.

National Senior Certificate (NSC)

Bachelor pass with English (50%)

National Certificate (Vocational) (NC(V))

Bachelor pass with English (50%)

Senior Certificate (Amended) (SC(a))

Bachelor pass with English (50%)

Senior Certificate (SC)

Endorsement with English (50%)

A cognate Higher Certificate OR cognate 240 credit Diploma OR an Advanced Certificate OR 360 credit Diploma or Degree may satisfy the minimum admission requirements to degree studies.

If discipline not cognate at least 20% of credits must be academic literacy or numeracy related.

International

An USAf Exemption Certificate is required meeting the minimum of 50% for English OR requisite English test e.g. TOEFL, IELS.

Alternate Admission

(Should the English requirement not be met at NSC Grade 12, entrance may be granted if the English requirement is met based on the final Grade 11 mark.)

English

NSC 40-49% (If 50% min in final Grade 11 results was achieved.)
