MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

National Senior Certificate (NSC)

English: 50% and Maths/HG: 40% or Math Lit/SG: 60%

National Certificate (Vocational) (NC(V))

English: 50% and Maths/HG: 50% or Math Lit/SG: 60%

Senior Certificate (SC)

Endorsement with English: 50% and Maths/HG: 40% or Math Lit/SG: 60%

Senior Certificate (Amended) (SC(a))

English: 50% and Maths/HG: 40% or Math Lit/SG: 60%

International

An USAf Exemption Certificate to degree studies is required and meeting the relevant Maths and English requirements.

A cognate Higher Certificate or cognate 240 credit Diploma OR an Advanced Certificate or 360 credit Diploma may satisfy the minimum admission requirements to degree studies.

If discipline not cognate at least 20% of credits must be academic literacy or numeracy related.
